Brief Portrait

Osnabrück University

Osnabrück University is a dynamic place to study, offering a broad range of courses with strong research and quality credentials. The University is an integral part of a vibrant city that is rich in tradition and culture. Founded in 1974, the University soon earned itself an international reputation, and positioned itself to attract academics who are leaders in their fields and to secure ample funding. The University is renowned for its excellent standards in academic supervision.

Osnabrück University offers more than 160 attractive, cutting-edge degree programs. The range of courses comprises future-oriented Bachelor and Master's programs and the traditional Law program culminating in a State Examination. The programs prepare graduates excellently for the national and international labor market, offering them outstanding job prospects.

A total of over 900 professors, lecturers and scientific staff research and teach across ten Schools. With a student enrolment of almost 12,000, the University is an ideal size, and new students will have no problems finding their way round campus.

The University's location is an additional advantage. Many of its buildings are in the immediate vicinity of the historic Old Town, and are easy to reach on foot or by bicycle. The administrative headquarters are housed in the former prince-bishop's castle. The Natural Sciences, Mathematics, Computer Science and Systems Science facilities are located in the Westerberg district. With theaters, museums, movie theaters and numerous exhibitions, Osnabrück provides its students with a rich cultural offering.

Osnabrück University Botanical Garden offers students a place to relax and take a break. This setting is also used as a teaching and research facility.

High standards in academic supervision and support

The University attaches great importance to supervising its students to the highest standard. A wide range of Bachelor programs within the Dual Major Bachelor's Degree enables students to obtain an undergraduate degree after six semesters. One-Subject Master's programs and the Master of Education (Gymnasium) follow on from there. The education and professional training of teachers who wish to teach at a Grundschule, Hauptschule, Realschule or Berufsschule also operates under the provisions of the Bachelor and Master system.

In addition, the University also offers innovative consecutive degree programs for those who wish to specialize in just one subject, for example Biology, Geoinformatics, Physics, Psychology or Management and Economics. The University also devotes special attention to interdisciplinary approaches in research and teaching. One example of this is the Applied Systems Science degree program where students learn to develop problem-solving strategies from the perspective of different scientific disciplines. The Bachelor and Master's programs in European Studies/ European Governance and Cognitive Science qualify students for the international labor market. The Master's program in International Migration and Intercultural Relations prepares future employees in this sector to deal with the social and cultural aspects of migration and integration. Osnabrück University is breaking new ground in the area of Islamic Religious Education and Theology in Germany.

Interdisciplinary research

One feature of research at Osnabrück University is the linking of different academic disciplines. The interdisciplinary Institutes of Migration Research and Intercultural Studies, Cognitive Science, Environmental Systems Research and Early Modern Intercultural Studies all make use of the opportunity to develop a deeper understanding by taking a broader view. The prevention of occupational skin diseases and early childhood education and development are further key areas firmly established at the University's Associated Institutes. The German Research foundation (DFG) has funded the Collaborative Research Center for "Physiology and dynamics of cellular micro-compartments" in the Department of Biology since 2011 and the Research Training Group in Com-



binatorial Structures in Geometry since 2013. The University's European Legal Studies Institute is one of Europe's most important research facilities for comparative law and the harmonization of law.

In 2014, a Humboldt Professorship – one of the most valuable research awards in Germany – was awarded to the Institute of Environmental Systems Research. In 2016, a further research building of national importance will be ready for use by the interdisciplinary Center for Cellular Nanoanalytics.

Development of young scholars

One of the University's central tasks is to train young researchers and to further their potential – a task it embraces with a great deal of commitment, as evident in the successful acquisition of PhD programs, amongst other things.

In 2009, the PhD Career Center (ZePrOs) was set up at the University, providing PhD research students from all Schools across the University with an umbrella organization. The training and personal support offered by the PhD Career Center give students the opportunity to hone their research skills and acquire competencies relevant to the labor market. The University organizes a special monitoring program to ensure that highly qualified women are in the best position possible to achieve their career goals.





International exchange

The academic and scientific world thrives on cross-border communication. For this reason, a period of study abroad is part of many students' individual academic programs. The modularization of study content, the European Credit Transfer System (ECTS) and partnerships with around 100 universities around the world facilitate study abroad. In addition, the Schools maintain direct links with a large number of academic institutions within Europe and further afield. Besides joint research projects, the most important elements of these cooperative agreements are academic and student exchange. International students make up six percent of Osnabrück University's student population. Osnabrück Student Services, which has regularly won awards, helps German and international students to find accommodation, and organizes student catering and accommodation locally.

Strong regional links

With almost 1,700 employees and a budget of around € 120 million (2013), Osnabrück University is a vital contributor to the local economy. Numerous partnerships with businesses and institutions give students the opportunity to gain practical experience at an early stage of their studies.

Another example of the University's strong ties and public outreach is the Erich Maria Remarque Peace Center. This institution, named after the world-famous writer born in Osnabrück, is supported jointly by the City and the University. As the City of the Peace of Westphalia of 1648, Osnabrück and the University also join forces to call for peace and tolerance within the nationally renowned Osnabrück Peace Forum.
