All newcomers to Osnabrück, whether from Germany or abroad, are required to register their new place of residence with the Citizens' Office (*Bürgeramt*) within two weeks of their arrival. To do this, you must book an appointment online as soon as possible at https://timeacle.com/business/index/id/332/row_id/299. Click on "Anmeldung" to book a ticket, then press the "Weiter"/ "Next" button. Select an available time for an appointment on 14 October, then click on "Weiter"/ "Next". Enter your personal details and click on the two privacy boxes. Then click on "Buchung bestätigen" / "Confirm booking". You will receive an email from timeacle GmbH Co. & KG with your appointment ticket, which you should keep ready for your appointment.

If you have made an appointment for 14 October, please go to the Citizens' Office at the Stadthaus at the time of your appointment. You will need to show the following documents: your **appointment ticket**, your **ID card** or **passport** and your **Wohnungsgeberbestätigung** (housing provider confirmation – this is a different document from your tenancy agreement). Please note that you cannot register without these documents.

Of course, you can also make an individual appointment with the Citizens' Office at any time before 14 October if you plan to arrive in Osnabrück earlier.

If you cannot make an appointment for 14 October (e.g. because there are no appointments left), or if you cannot attend your scheduled appointment on 14 October (e.g. because you have not yet found accommodation and therefore do not have a *Wohnungsgeberbestätigung*), or if you will be arriving in Osnabrück after 14 October, you will have to make your own individual appointment with the Citizens' Office.

Preparation of the formalities for applying for a residence permit with the Foreigners' Authority (Ausländerbehörde)

If you enter Germany **without a visa** and your stay exceeds three months, you will have to apply for a residence permit. If you enter Germany **with a visa** and your visa expires before the end of your stay, you will have to apply for a residence permit. Students from EU Member States, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway or Switzerland do not require a visa or a residence permit, and therefore do not need to attend this session.

The system for applying for an appointment with the Foreigners' Authority has been digitalized. During our group meeting with a staff member of the Foreigners' Authority on Thursday, we will guide you through the process of applying online for an appointment with them. Please bring a laptop or smartphone so that you can store the following documents, ready for uploading on Thursday:

- ✓ passport
- ✓ enrolment certificate
- ✓ proof of health insurance
- ✓ proof of sufficient funding (bank statements, blocked account, declaration of commitment, scholarship)
- ✓ registration confirmation (from the Citizens' Office)

Placement test for German as a Foreign Language courses

Although your chosen degree programme may be taught entirely in English, you will get much more out of your stay in Osnabrück if you are able to speak at least some German. It will make everyday activities such as shopping, going out, etc. easier and allow you to expand your circle of friends. We therefore strongly recommend that you find the time to attend one of the several German as a Foreign Language courses offered by the Language Center (starting from 4 November).

To ensure that you are placed at the right level, the Language Center will conduct a placement test on 17 October 2024 at the Westerberg Campus (no registration required). If you are a complete beginner, you do not need to take the test. If you have already passed a German language test (e.g. TestDaF, DSH, telc or Goethe-Zertifikat), you will be placed in a course based on your test results, i.e. you do not need to take the placement test. Only students with some previous knowledge of German, without any proof of their level, are required to take this placement test. Based on your test score, you will be placed on the appropriate language course.
